Firstly thanks to all members who responded to the survey we sent out earlier in the month asking whether they supported the ParaQuad Tasmania complaint on the new Parliament Square development access issue. Thirty percent of members responded and all were in favour of the Association pursuing the case. I will keep members informed of the progress of the anti-discrimination case as it proceeds.

The Committee of Management will this month adopt a new Strategic Plan for the Association. The Plan will guide the Committee's decision making into the future and prepare the Association for the changing landscape in the disability sector. The plan will focus of the core mission and principles of the Association to support people with spinal cord injury and physical disability.



As a result of targeted marketing and excellence in presentation, in January Glenn Moore Units recorded their highest occupancy rate since opening in 2009. The Units continue to offer fully accessible accommodation for people with spinal cord injury and physical disability, their families, friends and carers.

The ParaQuad Tasmania 2019 State Boccia Titles are being held at the Elphin Sports Centre in Launceston on Saturday 30th and Sunday 31st March. We have twelve entries for the event including three from interstate. On behalf of the Association I offer big congratulations to Joe Chivers who has just been selected by Hawthorn Football Club in the draft for the upcoming Victorian Wheelchair Aussie Rules season. Most of you would be aware that the concept of Wheelchair Aussie Rules was the brainchild of our own Kevin Faulkner. The game has really exploded in the AFL states especially Victoria where there are five teams attached to AFL clubs.

ParaQuad Tasmania will not have a representative team at this year's Wheelchair Aussie Rules National Carnival being held in Adelaide due to the unavailability of a number of the regular players, hopefully Tassie will be back bigger and better next year to go one step further than their silver medal in 2018. Call for members:

If you are a person with disability or a carer, family member or someone with a demonstrated interest in disability issues, you are invited to express interest in becoming a member of the Premier's Disability Advisory Council (PDAC). Up to four positions will be available.

To ensure statewide representation, people from the North and North West are strongly encouraged to apply. PDAC assists the Tasmanian Government to implement Accessible Island: Tasmania's Disability Framework for Action 2018-2021 and provides advice on whole-of-government policy and programs that impact on Tasmanians with disability. The closing date for expressions of interest is 5pm Friday 29 March 2019.

The game started and it was full on from the first ball up. The Roos kicked 4 quick goals through silky smooth ball movement. But the Tassie team was up for the challenge, cutting the margain to one goal at the quarter time break. From there, the tempo lifted into top gear. Richard Jones broke through the pack, recieved a pass on the outside of the right pocket and drilled a goal home over the top of his defender. Kirby Parsons kicked a superb goal from the middle third of the court to electrify the crowd and bring about a huge roar of applause.

For the Kangroos, Josh Christian povided a stand out performance. The mark and goal of the game was taken by Josh in the same passage of play. After a juggling effort behind the back mark, Josh rolled into goal unopposed to kick his fifth goal and kill any chance of the Tassie team coming away with the win.

Equal Opportunity Tasmania

To Report discrimination or make a Complaint about discrimination - what's the difference?

The Anti-Discrimination Commissioner of Tasmania through her office, Equal Opportunity Tasmania:

Investigates complaints of discrimination and prohibited conduct (including offensive conduct, sexual harassment, inciting hatred, victimisation, promoting discrimination or knowingly aiding and abetting a breach of the Anti-Discrimination Act (1998)).

Advises and makes recommendation to the Minister on matters related to discrimination and prohibited conduct.

Consults, inquires into and disseminates information about discrimination and prohibited conduct and its effects.

Undertakes research and educational programs to promote attitudes, acts and practices against discrimination and prohibited conduct.

Complaints of discrimination are a core part of the Commissioner's functions and while complaints usually send out a negative feeling, the Commissioner has the view that complaints are important because complaints are the key to a change for the better. The Commissioner, in her 2018 Annual Report encourages people who have witnessed or who have experienced discrimination and prohibited conduct to speak up, to lodge a complaint or even report it anonymously.

The Commissioner understands that complaining can be a daunting and difficult step to take for all sorts of reasons and as a result offers another way for people to provide information about discrimination or prohibited conduct. This is through the 'Report it' form.

The 'Report it' form is a short easy to follow document that is not a complaint, can be lodged anonymously and most importantly tells the Commissioner about incidents of discrimination or prohibited conduct happening in the community.

It is an invaluable tool because 'Report It' forms can indicate trends of discrimination or prohibited conduct in certain geographical areas, in relation to certain personal attributes such as disability and in relation to certain public areas of life, for example at bus stops, on buses, in relation to certain service providers or in employment.

The message the Commissioner hopes readers take away from the above, if they don't want to make a formal complaint, is that they can speak up about discrimination and prohibited conduct, they see or experience, by reporting it to Equal Opportunity Tasmania or by completing a 'Report it' form either online at -
